Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach half term, I am writing with an update on the Trust news and some of the exciting events which have been happening in recent weeks. This has been a very successful half term, with so much packed in over a short period of time, and it has been fabulous to see so many children enjoying a wide range of activities and events beyond the classroom.

Parent Survey

Many thanks to all the parents who took the time to respond to our survey in April. Each headteacher will respond to the parents of their school so if you haven't yet received this, you will very shortly. The vast majority of responses were very positive about the work each school is doing and it is particularly heartening to know that an overwhelming majority of parents say that their children are happy and safe in our schools. Those of you who completed the survey will know that the final few questions were set in collaboration with Liverpool Hope University as part of a research project to look more deeply into children's mental health. The anonymous responses will be analysed by the university over the summer and will inform our strategies and approaches to supporting our children's mental health in the future. This is an important issue for us and it is exciting to be a part of a project which will hopefully lead the way in supporting schools in this area.

Growth

We are delighted that Heswall Primary and Thingwall Primary have

both been given Academy Orders from the DfE to join Oak Trees later in the year, and we are also delighted that Irby Primary and Black Horse Hill Junior School have officially applied to join us early in 2024, subject to DfE approval. This will take the Trust, we hope, up to around 3500 children and around 400 staff, and we are looking forward to welcoming new schools into the Trust next year.
